The cemetery was located on Walker Street where the old St. Hyacinth's school building now stands; this area was known as Pike Hill. When the school was built the remains of the Haskell family were disinterred and reburied in Woodlawn Cemetery, Section D, under a memorial stone pictured above. The stone states: *"These stones with remains here buried, removed from Pike Hill lot June 1905. Names of persons known to have been buried there:..."*

(At the top of the memorial stone is a piece of an original slate headstone containing the names of two children. The letters 'Obt' are used in place of 'died on'.)
